NEW LAW 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-758.1 of Title 63, unless 19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20 As used in this section: 21 "Abortion" means the use or prescription of any instrument, 22 medicine, drug, or any other substance or device intentionally to 23 terminate the pregnancy of a female known to be pregnant with an

intention other than to increase the probability of a live birth, to

preserve the life or health of the unborn person after live birth, or to remove a dead unborn person who died as the result of a spontaneous miscarriage, accidental trauma, or a criminal assault on the pregnant female or her unborn person; and

- 2. "Abortion-inducing drug" means a medicine, drug, or any other substance prescribed or dispensed with the intent of terminating the pregnancy of a woman known to be pregnant, with knowledge that the termination will with reasonable likelihood cause the death of the unborn person. This includes the off-label use of drugs known to have abortion-inducing properties, which are prescribed specifically with the intent of causing an abortion, such as mifepristone (Mifeprex), misoprostol (Cytotec), and methotrexate. This definition does not apply to drugs that may be known to cause an abortion, but which are prescribed for other medical indications, such as chemotherapeutic agents and diagnostic drugs. The use of such drugs to induce abortion is also known as "medical", "medication", "RU-486", "chemical", "Mifeprex regimen", or "druginduced" abortion.
- B. No person shall knowingly or recklessly give, sell, dispense, administer, prescribe, distribute, traffic, or otherwise provide to any other person in this state an abortion-inducing drug to be used for the purpose of inducing an abortion in violation of Section 861 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes or for the purpose

of inducing labor with the intent to cause the death of the unborn person after live birth through intentional or negligent acts.

- C. In addition to such other penalties as may be prescribed by law:
- 1. Any person including, but not limited to, a health care provider as described in paragraph 2 of this subsection who is found to be in violation of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony; and
- 2. The licensing board of any health care provider found to be in violation of this section shall immediately revoke the health care provider's professional license.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-758.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

If any provision, word, phrase, or clause of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall make the entire act invalid and to this end, the provisions, words, phrases, and clauses of this act are declared to be inseverable.
