RESOLUTION 2

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution proclaiming Christ is King;  
recognizing the spiritual heritage of Oklahoma; and  
directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma has a rich history rooted in  
faith, resilience, and a commitment to values that uplift its  
people; and

WHEREAS, the acknowledgment of spiritual heritage has long been  
a cornerstone of the cultural identity of Oklahomans, reflecting the  
beliefs and convictions of many of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the phrase "Christ is King" represents a declaration of  
faith for millions of Oklahomans and Christians worldwide,  
symbolizing the sovereignty of Jesus Christ as a source of hope,  
unity, and moral guidance; and

1           WHEREAS, the Oklahoma State Legislature seeks to affirm the  
2 freedom of its citizens to express their deeply held beliefs,  
3 including freedom of speech without fear of punishment or  
4 retribution, recognizing the importance of religious liberty as  
5 enshrined in both the United States Constitution and the Oklahoma  
6 Constitution; and

7           WHEREAS, this proclamation serves as an expression of gratitude  
8 for the blessings bestowed upon the State of Oklahoma and as a  
9 recognition of the enduring influence of Christian faith in the  
10 lives of its people.

11           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION  
12 OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
13 CONCURRING THEREIN:

14           THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature hereby proclaims "Christ is  
15 King," recognizing the spiritual significance of this declaration to  
16 many of its citizens and honoring the role of faith in the history  
17 and culture of Oklahoma.

18           THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature expresses that this  
19 resolution is not intended to establish any religion or infringe  
20 upon the rights of any individual, but rather to celebrate the  
21 voluntary expression of belief that has shaped communities across  
22 the state.

23           THAT copies of this resolution be distributed to the Governor of  
24 Oklahoma and the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives,

1 and be made available to the public as a testament to this  
2 proclamation.
