7	An Act relating to amusements and sports; amending 3A O.S. 2021, Sections 602, 604.2, 606, and 624, which
8	relate to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act; modifying terms; directing the Oklahoma State
9	Athletic Commission to assume jurisdiction over certain licensing; directing Commission to halt
10	certain events; directing Commission to seek penalties in certain circumstances; prohibiting
11	promotion or participation in certain events; removing certain exceptions that relate to testing
12	for the human immunodeficiency virus, the hepatitis B virus, or the hepatitis C virus before the issuing of
13	a license; and providing an effective date.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 602, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 602. A. As used in the Oklahoma State Athletic
20	Commission Act:
21	1. "Administrator" means the administrator of the Oklahoma
22	State Athletic Commission;
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2. "Amateur combative sports event" means a combative sports
 event in which the participants have never been licensed as
 professionals in any combative sport;

3. "Amateur combative sports practitioner" means a person who
has never received or competed for any purse or other article either
for the expenses of training therefor or for participating in any
combative sports contest or exhibition which exceeds in monies or
other things of value a sum to be determined by the Oklahoma State
Athletic Commission;

4. "Amateur mixed martial artist" means a person eighteen (18)
years of age or older who has never received or competed for any
purse or other article either for the expenses of training therefor
or for participating in any combative sport contest or professional
exhibition which exceeds in monies or other things of value a sum to
be determined by the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission;

16 5. "Amateur mixed martial arts" means any form of competitive 17 pugilistic contest in which the participants have never been 18 licensed as professionals in any combative sport and blows are 19 delivered with any part of the hands, feet, or knees and multiple 20 combative disciplines are used including grappling. Such contests 21 take place in a rope-enclosed ring or fenced enclosed cage and are 22 fought in timed rounds;

6. "Applicant" means any <u>person</u>, individual, club, association,
 corporation, partnership or trust which submits to the Oklahoma

State Athletic Commission an application for a license or permit
 pursuant to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act;

7. "Booking agent" means independent contractors who act as
bookers, agents, agencies and representatives who secure engagements
and contracts for combative sports participants;

8. "Boxing" means any form of competitive pugilism or unarmed
combat in which a blow is usually struck which may reasonably be
expected to inflict injury, including, but not limited to, boxing,
wrestling, mixed martial arts, and kickboxing, but shall not include
the martial arts as defined by the provisions of this section;

9. "Broadcast" means any audio or visual transmission sent by any means of signal within this state, whether live or taped or time delayed, and includes any replays thereof. "Broadcast" shall not include any audio or visual transmission sent by any means of signal of any professional boxing event conducted outside this state;

16 10. "Cable system operator" means any person who makes available or provides customers a closed-circuit telecast which is pay-per-view, including any person who does so as a direct broadcast satellite provider or other multichannel video service provider;

11. "Closed-circuit telecast of professional combative sporting events" means telecast rights, including television, cable television, or pay-per-view telecasts, acquired by paying a licensing fee or by paying a contractual price by a business or individual, including, but not limited to, arenas, entertainment or

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meeting centers, restaurants, bars, taverns, hotels, motels, clubs, 1 and organizations, which offers the viewing of the event to the 2 public or to private residences. Such events shall include local 3 and state professional combative sports contests and professional 4 exhibitions as defined in this section. "Closed-circuit telecast" 5 means any such telecast of a professional combative sporting event 6 as described herein which is not intended to be available for 7 viewing without the payment of a fee, collected for or based upon 8 9 each event viewed, for the privilege of viewing the telecast, and 10 includes pay-per-view;

11 12. "Club" means an incorporated or unincorporated association 12 or body of individuals voluntarily united and acting together for 13 some common or special purpose;

14 13. "Combative sports" means any form of competitive pugilism 15 or unarmed combat in which a blow is usually struck which may 16 reasonably be expected to inflict injury, including but not limited 17 to boxing, wrestling, mixed martial arts, and kickboxing, but shall 18 not include the martial arts (singular) as defined by the provisions 19 of this section;

14. "Combative sports practitioner" means a person who competes or spars in a combative sports event and includes, including, but <u>not limited to</u>, boxers, kickboxers, mixed martial artists and wrestlers;

15. "Commission" means the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission;

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1 16. "Contest" means a combative sports event in which it is 2 reasonable to anticipate that the participants strive earnestly in 3 good faith to win;

17. "Corner person" means, but shall not be limited to, a
trainer, a second, or any other individual who attends the
participant during a match;

7 18. "Event" means a combative sports contest or exhibition 8 including but not limited to a match, bout, contest, show or 9 tournament;

10 19. "Exhibition" means a combative sports event in which the 11 participants show or display their skill by sparring without 12 necessarily striving to win;

13 20. "Judge" means an individual other than a referee who shall 14 have a vote in determining the winner of any contest;

15 21. "Kickboxing" means any form of competitive pugilistic 16 professional <u>or amateur</u> contest or exhibition in which blows are 17 delivered with the hand and any part of the foot. Such contests or 18 exhibitions take place in a rope-enclosed ring and are fought in 19 timed rounds:

20 22. "License" means a certificate issued by the Commission to 21 participants of sanctioned professional <u>or amateur</u> combative sports 22 contests, professional <u>or</u> exhibitions, and amateur mixed martial 23 arts contests and is a mandatory requirement for participation in 24 such events;

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23. "Manager" means an individual who controls or administers 1 the affairs of any professional combative sports participant, 2 including acting as a booking agent. "Manager" shall include the 3 representative of a manager as defined by the Commission; 4 24. "Martial arts" means any form of karate, kung fu, tae kwon-5 do, or any other form of martial or self-defense art; 6 25. "Matchmaker" means an individual who brings together 7 professional combative sports participants or arranges professional 8 9 combative sports contests or professional exhibitions; "Participant" means an individual who takes part in a 10 26. combative sports event; 11 "Pay-per-view telecasts of professional combative sports 12 27. events" means telecasts offered by cable television companies to 13 subscribers at a cost in addition to the monthly cable television 14 subscription rate. Such events shall include local and state 15 professional combative sports contests and professional exhibitions 16 as defined in this section; 17 "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, joint 28. 18 venture, limited liability company, club, association, corporation, 19 trust, or other entity any other group or combination acting in 20 21 concert, assignee, agent, employee, director, officer, or any other 22 representative of such person; 23

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29. "Physician" means an individual licensed under the laws of
 this state to engage in the general practice of medicine or
 osteopathic medicine;

30. "Professional combative sports practitioner" means an
individual eighteen (18) years of age or older who competes for
money, prizes, or purses, or who teaches, instructs, or assists in
the practice of combative sports or sparring as a means of obtaining
pecuniary gain;

9 31. "Professional combative sports event" means a combative
10 sports event in which the participants are paid a purse;

11 32. "Professional mixed martial arts" means any form of 12 competitive pugilistic contest in which the participants are paid a 13 purse and blows are delivered with any part of the hands, feet, 14 elbows, or knees and multiple combative disciplines are used to 15 include grappling. Such contests take place in a rope-enclosed ring 16 or fenced enclosed cage and are fought in timed rounds;

17 33. "Promote" or "promoting" means producing, staging, 18 sponsoring, organizing or otherwise holding a combative sports event 19 whether or not the event is open to the public;

34. "Promoter" means any <u>person or</u> individual, whether a resident or nonresident of Oklahoma, or club or corporation, whether domesticated or not domesticated in Oklahoma, that produces or stages professional contests, amateur mixed martial arts contests, or professional exhibitions conducted within this state and shall

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1 include any officer, director, or employees as defined by the 2 Commission;

3 35. "Pugilism" means combative sports or the skill or practice
4 of fighting with the fists;

36. "Purse" means the financial guarantee or any other 5 remuneration or thing of value for which a combative sports 6 practitioner participates in a professional combative sports event 7 and shall include the participant's share of any payment received 8 9 for radio broadcasting, television, including cable television, payper-view television, and closed-circuit television, and motion 10 picture rights. "Purse" shall also include gate receipts and any 11 12 other prizes;

13 37. "Ring official" means any individual who performs an 14 official function during the progress of a combative sports event or 15 amateur mixed martial arts event including but not limited to 16 timekeepers, judges, referees, and attending physicians;

17 38. "Sanctioning permit" means a permit issued by the
18 Commission to promoters who make application for official approval
19 of <u>a</u> professional <u>or amateur</u> combative sports events and amateur
20 mixed martial arts events event;

39. "Sparring" means to engage in a form of combative sport with jabbing or feinting movements, and the exchange of few heavy blows, such as occurs in a practice or exhibition boxing match;

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40. "Telecast promoter" means any promoter who shows or causes 1 to be shown in this state a closed-circuit telecast of any 2 professional combative sports event conducted in this state. 3 "Telecast promoter" shall not include a cable system operator; 4 41. "Trainer" means an individual who assists, coaches, or 5 instructs any professional combative sports practitioner or amateur 6 mixed martial artist with respect to physical conditioning, 7 strategy, techniques, or preparation for competition, professional 8 9 combative sports contests, or professional exhibitions; and

10 42. "Vendor" means any individual, firm, organization, club, or 11 corporation that participates in the conduct of a professional 12 combative sports event or amateur mixed martial arts event conducted 13 in this state by offering for sale food or merchandise, including, 14 but not limited to, wearing apparel, alcoholic and nonalcoholic 15 beverages, souvenirs, and programs.

B. The Commission may define any term which is not defined in
 the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act.

18 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 604.2, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 604.2. A. The mission of the Oklahoma State Athletic 21 Commission shall be to preserve and protect the health, safety and 22 welfare of combative sports event participants and the general 23 public through the effective regulation of combative sports in the 24 State of Oklahoma, while fostering an environment that expands

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1 existing combative sports events and brings new events into the 2 state.

B. The Commission shall have the power and duty to:

Promulgate rules and issue orders necessary to carry out the
 purposes of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act, and enforce
 the provisions of said act and the rules promulgated pursuant
 thereto;

2. Assume jurisdiction over all matters relating to the 8 9 licensing of amateur and professional combative sports 10 practitioners, amateur including, but not limited to, mixed martial artists, amateur kickboxers, professional boxers, corner persons, 11 12 booking agents, matchmakers, promoters, referees, judges, timekeepers, vendors, physicians, announcers, clubs, and 13 corporations associated with a an amateur or professional combative 14 sports event, amateur including, but not limited to, a kickboxing 15 event or amateur, mixed martial arts event, or professional boxing 16 17 event related thereto;

18 3. Act to halt the unlicensed promotion of professional 19 combative sports events and seek administrative, criminal, and civil 20 penalties against those engaged in booking, matchmaking, and 21 promoting of unsanctioned events;

4. Set license and permit fees pursuant to the requirements of
 the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act;

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4. <u>5.</u> Conduct investigations into the qualifications of
 applicants for licensure and registration;

5. <u>6.</u> Conduct investigations and proceedings for alleged violations of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act and order or subpoena the attendance of witnesses, the inspection of records and premises, and the production of relevant books and papers necessary to such investigations and proceedings;

8 6. 7. Develop and administer examinations for applicants for
9 licenses and permits; and

10 7. 8. Make such expenditures as may be necessary in the 11 performance of its duties.

C. Any rule promulgated, order made, or action taken prior to July 1, 1999, by the Commissioner of Labor or the Department of Labor pursuant to the provisions of, or rules issued pursuant to, the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act shall be considered valid and in effect unless amended, repealed, or rescinded by the Commission.

D. Any valid license, permit, certificate, or registration issued prior to July 1, 1999, by the Commissioner of Labor pursuant to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act, or rules promulgated pursuant thereto, shall remain valid and in effect until it expires pursuant to law or unless suspended or revoked by the Commission. Any application for a license, permit, certificate, or registration

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which is pending on June 30, 1999, is hereby transferred to the
 Commission.

E. All personnel, powers, duties, responsibilities, fund balances, encumbrances, obligations, and property, which shall include records, furniture, and equipment of the Department of Labor relating to the regulation of combative sports, are hereby transferred to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission.

8 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 606, is 9 amended to read as follows:

Section 606. A. The Oklahoma State Athletic Commission is 10 hereby vested with jurisdiction to issue sanctioning permits for all 11 12 professional and amateur combative sports contests and exhibitions, for all amateur including, but not limited to, mixed martial arts 13 contests and exhibitions and all amateur kickboxing contests and 14 exhibitions, professional boxing, and kickboxing held or given 15 within this state and to issue licenses for participants of 16 17 sanctioned contests and exhibitions.

B. 1. No person shall <u>It shall be unlawful to</u> promote, nor
shall any person <u>or</u> participate in, a professional <u>or amateur</u>
combative sports event or an amateur mixed martial arts event or an
amateur kickboxing event unless the event is sanctioned by the
Commission.

23 2. Except as provided in paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection C of
 24 this section, no person shall it shall be unlawful to promote an

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amateur combative sports event unless the event has been is
 sanctioned by the Commission.

3 3. Any person violating the provisions of this subsection shall
4 be punishable pursuant to the subject to the administrative and
5 criminal penalty provisions of Section 615 of this title.

C. Specifically exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma
State Athletic Commission Act are the amateur combative sports
contests or exhibitions conducted or sponsored by:

9 1. Any school, college, or university where the participants
are students regularly enrolled in such institutions and the
instructors, coaches, and trainers are employees of such
institutions. The term "school, college, or university" shall not
include a school or other institution whose principal purpose is to
furnish instruction in combative sports or sparring;

Any military installation or branch of the Armed Forces
 where the participants are employed by the military installation or
 are members of the branch of the Armed Forces sponsoring the contest
 or exhibition;

19 3. USA Boxing; and

20 4. The International Olympic Committee.

D. The following persons are specifically exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act:

Practitioners and instructors of the martial arts as defined
 in Section 602 of this title; and

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2. Instructors of amateur combative sports practitioners if
 such instructors are not required to be licensed pursuant to other
 provisions of the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act.

4 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 3A O.S. 2021, Section 624, is 5 amended to read as follows:

Section 624. A. Except as otherwise provided in this section, 6 prior to being issued a license pursuant to this act every 7 participant applicant shall submit a certified copy of results from 8 9 testing performed by a laboratory certified pursuant to 42 C.F.R. Part 493 verifying that the applicant is not infected with the human 10 immunodeficiency virus (HIV), the hepatitis B virus or the hepatitis 11 12 C virus. The testing shall be performed no more than Testing shall be conducted within three hundred sixty-five (365) days before the 13 application is submitted. A statement from a doctor of osteopathy 14 or medical doctor indicating that the applicant has successfully 15 completed a full course of vaccinations for hepatitis B may be 16 17 submitted in lieu of the results of testing for hepatitis B before the combative sports contest or exhibition the participant is 18 participating in. Except as otherwise provided in this section, an 19 applicant who receives positive results from any of the tests 20 21 required by this section shall be denied a license for the 22 particular contest.

B. If a participant must be replaced within twenty-four (24)
hours of an event, a promoter may replace the participant that has

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1	been pulled with a new participant that has complied with the
2	testing requirements found in subsection A of this section.
3	C. Notwithstanding the requirement for testing stated in
4	subsection A of this section, the participant and opponent, ring
5	official, and ringside physician may agree, in writing, to waive the
6	denial of licensure for failure to timely submit the required
7	certified test results, and by such signed written agreement, the
8	participant and opponent shall be granted a license to participate
9	in their particular contest.
10	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
