7	An Act relating to juvenile bureaus; amending 10A
8	O.S. 2021, Section 2-4-107, which relates to salaries and expenses; modifying salary limitations; and
9	providing an effective date.

11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10A O.S. 2021, Section 2-4-107, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 2-4-107. A. $\frac{1}{2}$. The salary of the director and other
15	employees of the bureau and any detention home established pursuant
16	to Section 2-4-108 of this title shall be fixed by the judge of the
17	Juvenile Division, subject to the general administrative authority
18	of the county commissioners of the contracting county. The salary
19	of the director shall not exceed ninety percent (90%) of salaries of
20	county Class A officers.
21	2. The salary of any other employee of the juvenile bureau
22	shall not exceed eighty-five percent (85%) of Class A county
23	officers.

The judge of the Juvenile Division, subject to the general 1 в. 2 administrative authority of the county commissioners of the contracting county, may fix a limit on the amount of expenses that 3 4 may be incurred by the director and assistants to the director, such 5 limit to be in the judgment of the judge adequate to care for the expenses necessary to carrying out the orders of the court in an 6 7 efficient and expedient manner. The director and assistants to the director and other personnel of the court shall keep and maintain 8 9 their offices at the place where the office of the judge of the 10 court is kept, unless the judge of the Juvenile Division, subject to 11 the general administrative authority of the county commissioners of the contracting county, shall direct otherwise. The offices of the 12 director and assistants to the director shall contain adequate 13 14 equipment, desk space and consultation rooms necessary for 15 appropriate office procedure.

In addition to their salaries, the director and assistants 16 С. 17 to the director shall be reimbursed at the same rate as state 18 employees for mileage traveled by them in the investigation of court 19 cases and in supervising probationers. The director and assistants 20 may also receive reimbursement, at the rate and in the manner 21 applicable to other county officers, for actual and necessary 22 expenses incurred by them in attending conferences, meetings, 23 seminars or official business of the court either within or outside 24 of the State of Oklahoma.

D. In all counties having a juvenile bureau, the budget of the juvenile bureau for salaries and expenses of the director, counselors and other employees shall be established and funded as follows:

5 1. All expenses incurred in complying with the provisions of
6 this article shall be a county charge or funded by a special sales
7 tax dedicated to juvenile programs and expenses;

8 2. The salaries and other compensation of all employees of the 9 juvenile bureau shall be fixed by the judge within the limit of the 10 total appropriations therefor; and

11 3. It is made the duty of the county excise board to make the 12 necessary appropriation and levy for the payment of salaries of the 13 director and all other employees, together with the expenses of 14 administering the bureau, consistent with the duty to do likewise 15 with the budget estimates of other county officers under the board's 16 jurisdiction, as required by the Constitution and laws of this 17 state.

4. Except in instances where it is entitled to representation because of insurance coverage, the district attorney of the county in which the juvenile bureau is located shall represent the juvenile bureau and any employee who was acting in his or her official capacity at the time of the act or omission complained of in any lawsuit. If the district attorney has a conflict of interest or otherwise declines to represent the juvenile bureau or its

1	employees, the county commissioners may request the assistance of
2	the Attorney General or authorize the employment of private counsel
3	for the juvenile bureau and its employees in their official
4	capacity.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
