L5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be

23	Beginning December 31, 2025, and no later than December 31 each
24	year thereafter, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department

- 20 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 21 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2254.3B of Title 74, unless
- 22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund
- 24 for the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department to be designated

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    the "State Parks Emergency Maintenance Revolving Fund". The fund
    shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,
    and shall consist of all monies received by the Oklahoma Tourism and
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    Recreation Department eligible under law and directed for deposit to
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    such fund. All monies accruing to the credit of said fund are
    hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma
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    Tourism and Recreation Department in amounts as authorized by the
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    Oklahoma Legislature, for the purpose of implementing the
    Department's Eight-Year State Parks Emergency Maintenance Plan, as
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    described in Section 2 of this act; provided, that in no event shall
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    an amount greater than twenty percent (20%) of the annual amount
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    accruing to the fund shall be used for funding operational expenses
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    of the Department in any given state fiscal year. Expenditures from
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    said fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer
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    against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the
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    Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
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    payment.
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SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
