C. Every person who, without justifiable or excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any assault or battery upon the person of a utility worker who is performing duties within their scope of employment, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term not exceeding two (2) years, or by a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

D. This section shall not supersede any other act or acts, but shall be cumulative thereto.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
