15	1ST SESSION OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:									
16	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for									
17	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,									
18	the following proposed amendment to Section 4 of Article XIII of the									
19	Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:									
20	SECTION 4. <u>A.</u> The Legislature shall provide for the compulsory									
21	attendance at some public or other school, unless other means of									
22	education are provided, of all the children in the State who are									
23	sound in mind and body, between the ages of eight and sixteen years,									
24	for at least three months in each year.

1	B. Parents and legal guardians shall have the right to direct									
2	the education of their children. The Legislature shall not regulate									
3	schools that do not receive public funds or other means of

11	This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends Section									
12	4 of Article 13. The Oklahoma Constitution currently requires									
13	all children to attend school, unless the children are receiving									
14	education in another way. This measure adds language declaring a									
15	parent or guardian's right to educate their child how they want									
16	to. This measure prevents the Oklahoma Legislature from passing									
17	laws that control the affairs of a private school, home school,									
18	or other school that does not receive public funds.
