11	approval required for modifications to the Oklahoma Constitution as proposed through an initiative
12	petition; modifying provisions for voter approval required for modifications to the Oklahoma

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17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
	BE II RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REFRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
18	1ST SESSION OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
19	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
20	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
21	the following proposed amendments to Section 3 of Article V and
22	Section 2 of Article XXIV of the Constitution of the State of
23	Oklahoma to read as follows:
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Section 3. Referendum petitions shall be filed with the Secretary of State not more than ninety (90) days after the final adjournment of the session of the Legislature which passed the bill on which the referendum is demanded. The veto power of the Governor shall not extend to measures voted on by the people. All elections on measures referred to the people of the state shall be had at the next election held throughout the state, except when the Legislature or the Governor shall order a special election for the express purpose of making such reference. Any Except as otherwise provided by this section, any measure referred to the people by the initiative or referendum shall take effect and be in force when it shall have been approved by a majority of the votes cast thereon and not otherwise. If any amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution is proposed pursuant to initiative petition, it shall only take effect and be in force when it shall have been approved by sixty percent (60%) of the votes cast thereon and not otherwise.

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The style of all bills shall be: "Be it Enacted By the People of the State of Oklahoma."

Petitions and orders for the initiative and for the referendum shall be filed with the Secretary of State and addressed to the Governor of the state, who shall submit the same to the people. The Legislature shall make suitable provisions for carrying into effect the provisions of this article; provided, that the Legislature may

not modify the provisions of this section with respect to the number of votes required for approval of a measure.

Section 2. Any amendment or amendments to this Constitution may be proposed in either branch of the Legislature, and if the same shall be agreed to by a majority of all the members elected to each of the two (2) houses, such proposed amendment or amendments shall, with the yeas and nays thereon, be entered in their journals and referred by the Secretary of State to the people for their approval or rejection, at the next regular general election, except when the Legislature, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of each house, shall order a special election for that purpose. If a majority sixty percent (60%) of all the electors voting on any proposed amendment at such election shall vote in favor thereof, it shall thereby become a part of this Constitution.

No proposal for the amendment or alteration of this Constitution which is submitted to the voters shall embrace more than one general subject and the voters shall vote separately for or against each proposal submitted; provided, however, that in the submission of proposals for the amendment of this Constitution by articles, which embrace one general subject, each proposed article shall be deemed a single proposal or proposition.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

3	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
4	This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends
5	Section 3 of Article 5 and it amends Section 2 of Article 24.
6	The Oklahoma Constitution provides a way to make amendments
7	either by the initiative petition process or by having the
8	Legislature refer proposed amendments to the people for their
9	approval or rejection. This measure would require that any
10	amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution be approved by sixty
11	percent (60%) of those voting on the question. Sixty percent
12	approval would be required whether the amendment was proposed
13	pursuant to an initiative petition or pursuant to a proposal
14	submitted to the people by the Legislature.
