**Research Analysis**

HB 1002 requires law enforcement to notify the victim of stalking of the availability to meet with a certified domestic violence program representative. Law enforcement is required to serve a copy of the Stalking Warning Letter unless the victim requests that the letter not be served. The measure allows law enforcement to request assistance from other law enforcement agencies when serving the letter in another jurisdiction. The measure provides procedures for the service of the letter. The measure requires law enforcement to enter the fact that the letter was issued into NCIC and requires report to be submitted to the court clerk to be entered into the Supreme Court Network. The measure removes a requirement that victims file complaints with law enforcement prior to filing petitions for protective orders.
