**Research Analysis**

The floor substitute to HB 1005 modifies and expands the requirements for proof of identity for voters in elections.

Key provisions include:

- Amends the definition of *proof of identity* to specify that it must satisfy all applicable requirements;
- Provides a temporary exception for voter identification cards for elections held prior to January 1, 2027;
- Requires that for elections conducted on or after January 1, 2027, all voters must present proof of identity that meets the full requirements;
- Tasks Service Oklahoma with developing and providing a free photo identification card to meet the voter identification requirements by January 1, 2027;
- Directs the Chief Executive Officer of Service Oklahoma to consult with the Secretary of the State Election Board to develop the photo identification card;
- States that the proof of identity requirements outlined in the bill will also apply to voters appearing at in-person absentee voting sites;
- Removes the issuance and replacement fees for REAL ID Noncompliant ID cards issued to inmates and removes the issuance and renewal fees for REAL ID Compliant ID Card; and
- Authorizes the Secretary of the State Election Board to promulgate rules and procedures necessary to implement the requirements of this section.

**CHANGES IN THE FLOOR SUBSTITUTE VERSION FROM THE INTRODUCED:**

The floor substitute version adds in language that removes certain fees for REAL ID Noncompliant ID Cards issued to inmates and REAL ID Compliant ID Cards.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The floor amendment to HB 1005 requires all non-compliant identification cards to be issued and replaced free of charge starting on November 1, 2025. Service Oklahoma anticipates a substantial increase in the number of ID replacements and original issuances. Ultimately, the precise fiscal impact may vary depending on the exact increase in demand, which is currently unknown. Applying this amendment to known data from 2024, the cost breakdown would be as follows:

- **State ID Renewals:** 47,546
- **State ID Replacements:** 35,492 (previously \$25 per replacement)
- **State ID Original Issuance:** 60,671

**Revenue Loss Breakdown:**

- **4-year ID holders (70%):** Previously paid \$25 per ID. Revenue loss from renewals and new issuances:  $(47,546 + 60,671) * 70% * \$25 = \mathbf{\$1,872,957.50}$
- **8-year ID holders (30%):** Previously paid \$50 per ID. Revenue loss from renewals and new issuances:  $(47,546 + 60,671) * 30% * \$50 = \mathbf{\$3,204,375.00}$
- **Replacements:** 35,492 IDs previously charged at \$25 each:  $35,492 * \$25 = \mathbf{\$887,300.00}$

Total estimated revenue loss = **\$4,404,352.50**

Using this methodology, Service Oklahoma (SOK) anticipates an FY-26 fiscal impact of approximately \$3,028,283 and \$4,542,425 in FY-27. Note that only the language in the amendment was used for purposes of this fiscal impact and was estimated separately from the language in the original measure.
