**Research Analysis**

HB 1075, as introduced, modifies the procedure used when a school district superintendent is recommending an employee for termination due to abuse or sexual abuse of a student.

The measure requires a school district superintendent to submit a copy of their recommendation for termination to the State Board of Education regardless of whether the staff member resigns before or after the recommendation is made. A report of such resignation, including any investigatory findings must also be sent to the State Board.

If the investigation into the staff member concludes without findings that support termination or criminal charges, the employee may petition for the expungement of the report.
