HB 1137 removes the requirement that the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation work to obtain federal funding or apply for federal grants relating to the Office of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons.

Fiscal Analysis

HB1137 modifies provisions related to Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP) in the State of Oklahoma. The measure removes a statutory requirement that the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) apply for certain federal funding, and also removes the statutory authorization for OSBI to coordinate with private entities to obtain funding or fulfill grant requirements. This measure does not prohibit the agency from voluntarily utilizing any existing federal funding mechanisms, and the agency does not anticipate budgetary impact from the removal of the statutory authorization for coordination with private entities related to MMIP. Therefore, in its current form, HB1137 is not anticipated to have a material impact on state budget or appropriations.
