**Research Analysis**

HB 1189, as introduced, creates the "Oklahoma Right to Garden Act of 2025," which establishes the right of citizens to grow their own vegetables on their personal property for personal consumption. The measure doesn't prohibit any municipality, city, or town from enacting ordinances or regulations related to size and proximity of gardens to locations that impact health and safety or regulations and ordinances related to water usage, fertilizer use, or invasive species.
