**Research Analysis**

HB 1215 creates the Oklahoma Human Trafficking Law. The measure includes extortion, obtaining property or money from another with consent, induced by a wrongful use of force or fear in the definition of coercion. Includes a definition of pimping. The measure modifies the penalty for violations by providing that the penalty may be imprisonment for up to 20 years. The measure provides that if the victim was under the age of 18, the penalty may not exceed 99 years in prison. Persons convicted of human trafficking for commercial purposes are required to register as a sex offender.
