Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 1412 prohibits chronic absenteeism from being a measure of school success on the state's ESSA Plan. The State Department of Education is required to replace chronic absenteeism with a measure of instructional time. This would require schools to be evaluated on their number of in-person school days, total school hours for the academic year, and school day length. The State Board of Education is required to submit an amendment for the ESSA Plan to the US Department of Education by August 1, 2025.

Further, the measure expands the list of activities that are accepted as postsecondary opportunities on the ESSA plan. The measure adds military readiness and scoring Silver Level or above on American College Testing (ACT) WorkKeys. Lastly, the measure clarifies that students who transfer in or out of a high school and/or emigrate to another country are not included in a school's 4 or 5-year graduation rate calculation.
