**Research Analysis**

HB 1412, as introduced, clarifies that students who transfer in or out of a high school and/or emigrate to another country are not included in a school's 4 or 5-year graduation rate calculation. The measure also prohibits chronic absenteeism from being a measure of school success on the state's ESSA Plan. Instead of chronic absenteeism, schools are required to administer climate surveys. Lastly, the measure expands the list of activities that are accepted as postsecondary opportunities on the ESSA plan. The measure adds military readiness and scoring Silver Level or above on American College Testing (ACT) WorkKeys.
