Research Analysis

The proposed policy committee substitute for HB 1484 requires school districts to integrate instruction on fentanyl abuse prevention into their substance abuse curriculum for grades 6-12. If the school offers a health class, the instruction must be taught in that class. The State Department of Education is required to adopt curriculum standards for such instruction that includes information about suicide prevention and local resources, in addition to information about fentanyl abuse prevention.
