**Research Analysis**

HB 1593 provides that when evaluating the credibility of a peace officer who is serving or will serve as a witness in a criminal proceeding, the attorney representing the state may not disqualify the peace officer as a witness on the basis of an allegation of misconduct by the peace officer that has not been finally adjudicated as sustained. The measure allows a peace officer who has been placed on a list as a noncredible peace officer to dispute the report and provides a procedure for an evidentiary hearing.
