**Research Analysis**

The proposed policy committee substitute to HB 1595 increases the punishment for assault from 30 days to up to 90 days in the county jail. The measure increases the punishment for assault and battery from 90 days to up to six months in the county jail.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB1595 increases the maximum amount of time that assault is punishable by from 30 days to 90 days, and increases the maximum amount of time that assault and battery is punishable by from 90 days to 6 months. Any change in the costs incurred by the Department of Corrections (DOC) is expected to be immaterial and/or absorbed by the agency. Therefore, this measure in its current form is anticipated to be budget neutral.
