Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute for HB 1628 authorizes the Construction Industries Board (CIB) to administer residential roofing endorsement requirements as they do for commercial roofing. The measure further outlines exam requirements for residential roofing contractors.

The measure also raises the initial roofing contractor registration fee from \$75 to \$500, raises the renewal fee from \$75 to \$250, and establishes a \$500 reinstatement fee for lapsed or expired registration longer than 60 days.

Additionally, the measure requires the CIB and to be listed as a certificate holder on a contractor's liability insurance policy.

The residential roofing endorsement does not apply to roofing contractors who work under an endorsed roofing contractor and only provide roofing construction without supplying materials.

Fiscal Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 1628 authorizes the Construction Industries Board to administer and enforce residential roofer endorsement provisions under the Roofing Contractor Registration Act. Additionally, the measure raises the initial roofing contractor registration certificate from Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) to Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), the annual renewal fee from Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) to Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), and adds a Five Hundred Dollar (\$500.00) reinstatement fee for lapsed or expired roofing contractor registrations. The purpose of these funds is to be used to implement and administer the provisions of the Roofing Contractor Registration Act. As the Construction Industries Board is a non-appropriated state entity, these increases in fees are not anticipated to result in any impact to state appropriated dollars.
