**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute to HB 1789 directs that a recreational vehicle dealer promoting its own private off-premises sales event where that dealer is the sole participating dealer is prohibited from conducting sales activities outside of its manufacturer designated area of sales responsibility. The measure allows a dealer to sell off-premises at sanctioned recreational vehicle sales event with other participating dealers inside or outside of the dealer's manufacturer-approved area of responsibility and provides that a dealer may not be denied a permit to sell at an off-premises location on the grounds that the sales promotion is being held within the relevant market area of another dealer of the same line-make. The measure requires a dealer to obtain written approval from the manufacturer or distributor to participate in a private recreational vehicle show and the sponsoring entity of a private sales event must provide written permission for the dealer to conduct the event on the sponsor's property.
