**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation for HB 1832 adds that authorized electronic monitoring devices are installed only in the common areas for intermediate care facilities and in both the common areas or in the resident's rooms in a nursing facility, assisted living center, or continuum of care facility. HB 1832 adds a definition of intermediate care facility which means an institution that is primarily for the diagnosis, treatment, or rehabilitation of the intellectually disabled or people with related conditions. The measure adds intermediate care facilities to statutes addressing electronic monitoring devices, but provides that electronic monitoring devices are installed only in the common areas for intermediate care facilities.
