**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 1847 requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to work with the State Fire Marshal to develop guidelines that allow family child care homes and large child care homes to operate under the fire protection requirements of the International Fire Code. These child care homes will not be denied an operation license if they comply with code requirements. No agency, municipality, county or other state political subdivision can make stricter fire requirements than the ones in the International Fire Code.

**Fiscal Analysis**
