Research Analysis

The policy recommendation to HB 1865 updates Oklahoma's election procedures by incorporating provisions related to felony convictions in tribal courts, emergency ballot printing, and election day voting locations. The measure authorizes the Secretary of the State Election Board to accept written notice from tribal court clerks regarding felony convictions and cancel the voter registrations of affected individuals in their respective counties. The bill also allows the Secretary to approve additional ballot printing on election day in cases of shortages or emergencies while maintaining existing provisions for accessible ballots. Additionally, the measure establishes that vote centers, where voters can cast ballots regardless of precinct, will not be used on election day, except in emergencies affecting specific precincts, as determined by the Secretary.
