**Research Analysis**

The policy committee amendment to HB 1886 lowers the minimum amount of time a person may be required to serve for human trafficking of a person under the age of 18 to not less than 10 years in prison.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The POLAMD1 to HB1886 modifies the minimum length of sentencing for human trafficking from 25 years to 10 years. This would create a potential cost savings to DOC as a result of shorter sentence lengths in these cases, however it is not expected to have a material impact on state budget or appropriations.
