**Research Analysis**

HB 1910, as introduced, authorizes the Conservation Commission to establish the Urban Agriculture Cost-Share Program with the purpose of promoting sustainable urban agriculture, improving food security, and enhancing green spaces in Oklahoma's urban counties. Through the program, the Commission will enter into contracts with eligible applicants, providing up to 85% of their project funding, capped at \$7,000 per applicant. The measure defines "eligible projects", "eligible applicants" and "urban counties".

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1910 creates the Oklahoma Urban Agriculture Cost-Share Program within the Oklahoma Conservation Commission. The Conservation Commission believes they have the staffing necessary to administer the program, so the agency anticipates no start up costs. The agency would utilize possible grant funds to cover the initial cost share, in addition to any one-time appropriated dollars allocated to the revolving fund created within the measure.
