**Research Analysis**

HB 1980, as introduced, prohibits state colleges and universities from inquiring about an applicant's criminal history if the student plans to attend virtually and will not reside on campus. Further the measure prohibits such institutions from inquiring about an applicant's behavioral conduct as a juvenile. Institutions that violate these provisions are subject to a fines, a loss of state funding, or other penalties.
