Research Analysis

The Floor Substitute for HB 2047 requires schools to call 911 as soon as possible if epinephrine is administered to a student. The measure further requires schools to provide teachers and staff with annual training regarding food allergies, recognizing anaphylaxis, and administering epinephrine.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN COMMITTEE SUB AND FLOOR SUB

The Floor substitute removes the word "injector", removes the emergency clause, and also removes the requirement for a school employee to have parent permission prior to administering epinephrine if the employee believes the student is having an anaphylactic reaction.
