**Fiscal Analysis**

As amended, the proposed oversight committee substitute to HB 2048 creates the 340B Nondiscrimination Act, which prohibits insurers and pharmacy benefit managers from engaging in discriminatory practices regarding the reimbursement of 30B drugs to 30B entities. The Attorney General is responsible for the enforcement of this act and may promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the duties of the measure. Civil fines may be imposed ranging from One Hundred Dollars (\$100) to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for each violation.

According to officials from the Attorney General's Office, the implementation of the measure will require the hiring of one attorney, one analyst, and one paralegal. The estimated total cost is Four Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$410,000). Additional appropriations would be required to cover this cost, resulting in a total impact of \$410,000 on the state budget.
