Research Analysis

Hb 2054 provides that a person participating in and successfully completing a diversion program for either a misdemeanor or felony offense or offenses shall be immediately eligible to have the offense or offenses expunged after completion of all court-ordered program conditions and payment of all fines, fees, costs, and assessments. The measure lowers the amount of time a person with a misdemeanor conviction must wait to apply for an expungement from 5 years to 3 years and for a non-violent offense from 7 years to 5 years. The measure provides that any person who has had a felony conviction expunged and has not been convicted of any other felony offense which has not been pardoned or expunged shall have restored the right to possess any firearm or other weapon and may apply for the right to carry a handgun under the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, perform the duties of a peace officer or gunsmith.
