Research Analysis

The proposed committee substitute for HB2110 creates the Bringing Sitcoms Home from Hollywood Pilot Program Act and changes the focus of the film incentive programs from films to live audience episodic television.

Eligible projects must have a minimum budget of \$200,000 per episode, must include at least six episodes per season and can receive a rebate for up to 30 percent of its qualified expenditures. The measure outlines the incentive structure and outlines a list of qualified activities that can be accomplished to increase the incentive percentage. To qualify for the maximum base percentage of 20 percent, a production project must utilize the service of apprentices. The number of apprentices required on project depends on the amount of qualified Oklahoma expenditures that are being claim for the incentive rebate.

The program will be administered by the Office of the Film and Music Commission, is limited to \$10 million in funding each year and will sunset on July 1, 2032.
