**Fiscal Analysis**

The second floor amendment to HB 2115 modifies the effective date of the measure. This amendment has no impact on the current fiscal analysis of the measure.

The committee substitute to HB 2115 transfers the Energy Conservation Assistance Fund from the Department of Commerce to the Department of Human Services. Per the Department of Commerce, this fund is comprised entirely of federal funding, which covers any administrative costs associated with the Weatherization Program that utilizes these funds. Therefore, this measure has no direct fiscal impact on state budgetary resources.
