Research Analysis

The proposed policy committee substitute to HB 2131 modifies the procedures for advising grand juries. The measure provides that a transcript of the testimony is to be made available to the attorney for the accused, the district attorney, assistant district attorney, attorney general or the assistant attorney general upon request. Persons who obtain a copy of a grand jury transcript are prohibited from disclosing its contents. Transcripts are prohibited from being used for any purpose other than in proceedings related to the grand jury testimony, civil asset forfeiture proceedings or an accusation for removal of a public official from the grand jury, without good cause supported by clear and convincing evidence. The pleadings relating to a request for grand jury transcripts are to be sealed and any hearing held pursuant to a request for grand jury transcripts is to be closed to the public unless the presiding judge finds that the public interest in unsealing the pleadings or opening the hearing to the public outweighs the public interest

HB2131 modifies procedures related to the request for transcripts in certain criminal proceedings.
