**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2158 defines the standard that a dealer management system provider may condition certain access and abilities regarding protected dealer data as compliance with "commercially reasonable" data security standards. The measure sets a legal standard of compliance for certain parties and does not mandate any action or expenditure by a state agency. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
