**Research Analysis**

HB 2184, as introduced, requires state colleges and universities to disclose any contracts entered into, or gifts received directly or indirectly, from sources located in designated hostile countries. The disclosures, provided to the State Regents, must include:

- The date;
- The amount;
- The purpose;
- Beneficiaries;
- Conditions;
- Foreign Source;
- Institutional recipient; and
- Termination date, if applicable.

The State Regents are required to publish such information on a website. Further, they may audit such a gift or contract. And lastly, the State Attorney General may file a civil action against a college or university that has failed to comply with this Act.
