The floor amendment for HB2258 updates references to clarify that the Oklahoma Corporation Commission is the official publisher of its precedential decisions.

Fiscal Analysis

The CS to HB2258 would require that the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) authenticate, preserve, and make permanently accessible to the public certain official legal materials. Officials with the OCC have provided the following information:

There would be a significant fiscal impact to the OCC if the agency is required to publish opinions with the Secretary of State (SOS). This is because doing so would require software changes and programming in order to properly correspond with the SOS in regards to the related documents. However, the agency is unable to quantify the extent of the impact at this time.

Based on the current form of HB2258, the OCC expects an unknown but significant fiscal impact as a result of the measure. Additionally, officials with the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) have provided the following information:

At this time, the AOC expects that potential costs would be an additional \$52,000 annually in subscription services, an additional \$25,000 annually for developer costs, and a \$12,500 one-time implementation labor cost. This is a preliminary analysis based on available information, and cost estimates may change pending further analysis.

Therefore, there is a potential first-year fiscal impact to the AOC of \$89,500 in FY26, and an ongoing cost of \$77,000 annually for FY27 onward. The AOC may seek additional funding to defray these costs.

The FA1 removes the fiscal impact to the OCC.
