## **Research Analysis**

The proposed Policy Committee Substitute to HB 2263 prohibits the operator of a motor vehicle from using or holding of a hand-held electronic cellular device in school zone or work zone. Punishment is a fine of not more than \$100. Municipalities are authorized to enact ordinances relating to this conduct. The Department of Public Safety may not assess points for violation and law enforcement is prohibited from confiscating or extracting information from the cellular device without consent.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2263 modifies Oklahoma law regarding the use of electronic devices while driving, specifically addressing hand-held cellular telephones and electronic communication devices. The measure also prohibits law enforcement from confiscating electronic devices without consent or extracting device information without probable cause or a valid search warrant. Municipalities may enforce similar ordinances, but their total fines cannot exceed \$100. After communication with the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
