## **Research Analysis**

The amendment to the policy committee recommendation to HB 2265 clarifies that the requirement for notaries public to maintain a journal of record for all notarial acts for 10 years does not apply to notarial acts performed for an established business relationship during the ordinary course of business.

HB 2265, as amended, adds an exam requirement to the application process for notaries public. The Office of the Oklahoma Secretary of State is to administer an exam to all notary public applicants based on a course offered by the Office that covers the laws, rules, procedures, and ethics relevant to notary public duties. Additionally, the measure requires notaries public to maintain a journal of record for all notarial acts except for notarial acts performed for an established business relationship during the ordinary course of business. Notaries must keep the journal of record for 10 years and entries in the journal must contain certain information as laid out in the measure.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The POLREC to HB2265 adds certain examination requirements for notaries public. The office of the Secretary of State (SOS) must administer the exam, and shall offer regularly a course of study to applicants who do not hold a notary commission in the state of Oklahoma. Officials with the SOS have provided the following cost analysis to administer the provisions of HB2265:

HB-2265 SOS Notary Changes- fiscal impact

The SOS expects to incur a total cost of \$170,760 for software updates to the current filing system and to contract with a vendor to maintain compliance with the training requirements of the measure. Given that the SOS is a non-appropriated entity, Officials with the agency have stated that these expenses will be absorbed by the office by using existing budgetary resources. Therefore, there is no direct impact to the state budget or appropriations.

The POLREC-AMD1 to the measure clarifies provisions related to the exam requirements. This does not change the fiscal impact of the measure.
