Research Analysis

The second floor amendment to HB 2302 establishes that OMES is to maintain all streets, roads, and state-owned parking lots within the Oklahoma State Capitol grounds.

HB 2302, as amended, designates certain parking spaces on the Oklahoma State Capitol grounds to be assigned by the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The measure also authorizes the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to use the southernmost row of parking spaces in the south parking lot of the Oklahoma State Capitol grounds for a large vehicle inspection station. DPS is allowed to post signage regarding the large vehicle inspection station along Lincoln Boulevard and at the gatehouses for both the Senate and the House of Representatives. All unassigned parking spaces in the south parking lot and the parking lot east of the Oklahoma State Capitol Building on the east side of Lincoln Boulevard are reserved for visitors. Additionally, the measure establishes that OMES is to maintain all streets, roads, and state-owned parking lots within the Oklahoma State Capitol grounds.

Fiscal Analysis

The adoption of Floor Amendment 1 would not change the fiscal impact of the measure, which remains:

HB 2302 in its current form reallocates areas of the Capitol parking lot. The measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the State Budget or State Revenues.

Floor Amendment 2 moves the duty of maintaining all streets, roads, and state-owned parking lots within the boundaries of the "State Capital Park" to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES). It also authorizes OMES to expend any money appropriated for such uses. As the bill moves the management over and contemplates future appropriations for construction and maintenance, but does not require it, the fiscal impact of the measure is unchanged.
