Research Analysis

HB 2829, as introduced, makes it unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, hold or offer for sale, or distribute any cultivated meat product in the state. Any person who violates this will be found guilty of a misdemeanor upon conviction. The license of a food seller may be suspended or revoked as well. The Oklahoma State Department of Health may adopt rules as necessary. Nothing in this section will be construed as preventing any research regarding the production of cultivated meat products.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2829 prohibits the manufacture, sale, or distribution of cultivated meat in Oklahoma. The State Department of Health (OSDH) has the authority to adopt rules for enforcement. Officials from OSDH confirmed that the measure's requirements can be integrated into existing processes at no cost, thus having no direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
