**Bill Analysis**

SB 112 creates the categories of “residential journeyman plumber” and “unlimited journeyman plumber.” Residential journeyman plumbers shall only be authorized to work on detached one- or two-family dwellings. Applicants for a residential journeyman plumber or plumbing contractor examination shall hold an associate’s degree or vocational diploma certifying completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the Committee consisting of a minimum of 1,000 classroom hours and at least 2,000 hours of experience in the plumbing trade, have at least 3 years of experience in the plumbing trade, 2 years of experience with written approval from the supervising licensed plumbing contractor, 2 years of experience in the plumbing trade while serving in the United States Armed Forces, or a current out-of-state plumbing license. Applicants for an unlimited journeyman plumber examination shall have at least 3 years of experience in the plumbing trade, an associate’s degree or vocational diploma certifying the completion of 1,000 classroom hours and at least 2,000 hours of experience in the plumbing trade, 3 years of experience in the plumbing trade while serving in the United States Armed Forces, or a current out-of-state plumbing license.
