**Bill Analysis**

SB 379 authorizes any person whose booking photo is published to request the publisher to remove the photo. The request for removal shall be sent by registered mail and include sufficient proof of identity. The publisher shall remove the photo within 10 days of the request. If the publisher does not remove the photo, the requesting individual may pursue civil action to enjoin the continued publication of the photograph. The court shall award \$1,000.00 per day for continued publication of the photograph, or \$5,000.00 per day for republishing the photograph after being required to remove the photograph. Businesses engaged in publishing such photographs may not solicit or accept fee or other form of payment for the removal of the photographs. The provisions of this measure shall only apply to businesses primarily engaged in the publication of such photographs for commercial purpose or pecuniary gain.
