**Bill Analysis**

SB 444 authorizes any person who obtains a controlled dangerous substance in accordance with state and federal law to deliver the substance to an authorized person for disposal. The measure provides that a person authorized to dispose a decedent's property may deliver any controlled dangerous substances in the decedent's possession to an authorized person for disposal. Hospice employees who provided care to the decedent may handle any controlled dangerous substance that was lawfully dispensed to the decedent prior to death even if such employees are not registered. Such employees must complete, sign, and submit to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control a form for disposal.
