**Bill Analysis**

SB 54 modifies sentencing provisions relating to persons convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicating substances twice within 10 years. The measure directs the court to require such a person to use an ignition interlock device for a minimum of 30 days. The measure also increases the minimum days of use for such a device for persons convicted of third and subsequent offences from 30 days to 90 days. The measure modifies the scope of violations considered to be aggravated driving under the influence and modifies the sentencing provisions for conviction of such offense.
