## **Bill Analysis**

SB 758 prohibits a school district or charter school from counting days or portions of days when school is closed and virtual instruction is provided toward the 180-day or 1,080-hour requirement for the school year except as provided for in the measure. Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year and each school year thereafter, the measure allows a school district or charter school to close and provide virtual instruction for up to 2 days or 12 hours which may count toward the classroom instructional time requirement only if the Superintendent of Public Instruction approves a virtual instruction plan approved by the school district board of education or charter school governing board, the Governor issues a state of emergency or a proclamation for a specific reason relating to the school's operations, and the school district board of education or charter school governing board approves the use of virtual instruction. The measure also requires the State Department of Education by June 30, 2027, and each subsequent June 30 to publish on its website and electronically submit to the Governor and legislative leaders a report with information regarding the use of virtual instruction.
