**Bill Analysis**

SB 939 provides that the provisions of the Homemade Food Freedom Act shall not prohibit the sale of homemade food for home consumption from a retail space located at the ranch, farm, or home where the food is produced. Retailers selling such food to informed end consumers must display a sign showing the food was not inspected. If the retailer is associated with a commercial food establishment or sells any inspected product, the retailer shall comply with the rules adopted by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry that provide for informed consumers and safe storage. The measure exempts farms selling ungraded milk and eggs produced from their own livestock from certain provisions of law.
