**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

HB1683 requires health benefits plans to offer coverage for enrollees to obtain a three-month supply of a contraceptive drug at once the first time the enrollee obtains a drug, and a twelve month supply at once each subsequent time the enrollee obtains the same drug. The proposal also clarifies that the enrollee can request a smaller supply of the contraceptive drug and that the prescribing provider may prescribe a smaller supply if the prescription is supported by clinical utility and medical appropriateness.

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority estimate a \$250,000 fiscal impact annually to the HealthChoice plan based on current utilization, disenrollment rates, and the percentage of contraceptive users - \$200,000 is estimated for medication costs, \$50,000 for prior authorization and administrative costs. OHCA also expects an impact of \$260,000 to one of the Medicaid managed care plans.
