**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

This bill directs the State Board of Education to issue a request for proposals for the selection of a statewide student information system by certain date.

A statewide SIS for 542 districts will have varying costs, depending on the scale and resources provided.

Estimated implementation cost: \$20,000,000 - \$40,000,000 depending on resources

OSDE Staffing impact: up to \$1,000,000 in staff needed to support

Annual Recurring Costs: Dependent on the result of the RFP, but expected \$15,000,000 - \$25,000,000

OSDE Vendor time and effort: up to \$1,500,000 for infrastructure and data validations.

The cost of this is completely dependent on the result of the specified RFP and the requirements defined by OSDE. Given 400+ school districts, primarily rural schools, utilize the same SIS, they will need extensive support if their current vendor is not selected. Expect up to 3 years from legislation to implementation and a spend of \$40,000,000+.
