**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 156 modifies the penalty for falsely reporting a crime. The measure provides that if the crime falsely reported is a felony, the person who falsely reported the crime shall be guilty of a felony. Penalties associated with the falsely reported misdemeanor or felony shall be the same penalty for falsely reporting the crime. The Department of Corrections does not anticipate any fiscal impact that could not be absorbed by their current budget.
