**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 171 requires the Department of Public Safety to create a security plan for the Oklahoma State Capitol and to update the plan every 3 years. It creates within the Legislative Service Bureau the position of Capitol Liaison to the State Capitol Preservation Commission. It eliminates the State Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee. It modifies the membership of the State Capitol Preservation Commission.

To fulfill the provisions of SB171, the Legislative Service Bureau would need to hire one full-time position at an estimated FY'26 cost of \$93,500 (\$90,000 salary and one-time cost of \$3,500 for computer hardware, software, and accessories). OMES and DPS do not anticipate any impact on their agencies.
